She also performed at the National College Dance Gala at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.

Her career has included teaching, directing, coaching, and choreographing in Louisiana, Texas, and Florida. She served as Artistic Director of Cj's Studio in Fort Worth, Texas, and later returned to SLU, where she majored in Dance, minored in Kinesiology, and served as President of the Moxie Dance Project. She has choreographed for numerous performances and festivals, including the American College Dance Festival, Fanfare Celebration of the Arts, and the Columbia Theatre for the Performing Arts.

After earning her degree in 2009, Ms. H continued sharing her passion for dance through elite studios, ballet programs, children's productions, afterschool programs, and competitive dance training. In 2018, she returned home to New Orleans, where she taught Special Education, physical education, track, and creative movement. She also served as Dance Director at Audubon Gentilly and founded/coached the AG GEMS, providing performance opportunities for 5th–8th grade dancers at school events, parades, and community celebrations.

Ms. H is currently a member of the Nola Bombshells Performance Team and recently performed in 10 Mardi Gras parades during the 2026 season. She hopes to continue mentoring, coaching, and inspiring young dancers through her love of dance.
